- **2002** Utah Transit Authority announces Mid-Jordan TRAX line to Daybreak.
- **2003** Construction begins on roads and infrastructure.

2004 Oquirrh Lake begins to fill. Inaugural sledding season at Hillside Park.

Founders Park Village opens and first residents move in.

2005 Daybreak Community Center opens its doors to weightlifters, cardio boxers, and partyers

First community garden gets planted.

Classes begin at Daybreak Elementary.

2006 200,000 fish move into their new home at Oquirrh Lake.

Eastlake Village opens with a huge lakeside party.
